I. In Exile - 1 Kings 8:46-48

- 1. All have sinned (verse 46)
 - -when they sin against you
- Rea -to believe that all sin is one thing to have someone sin against YOU is quite another
 - 2. And you become angry with them and give them over to their enemies
 - 3. In this circumstance Solomon asked God for mercy for them
 - -if they turn and repent (verse 47)
 - -have a change of heart
 - -note that the repentance takes place in a foreign land
 - 4. Solomon gives the words of the "repentance" "we have sinned..."
 - 5. If they turn back to you (verse 48)
 - -with their entire heart and soul
 - -deep sincere repentance
- Rea -pause here... when we say "God forgive us if we have sinned..." is that deep sincere repentance?
- 6. God's discipline should lead to repentance
- Rea -often it does not... how so?
- Rea -true repentance leads to true forgiveness false repentance does not
 - 7. Pray toward the land you gave their ancestors
 - -the city you have chosen
- Rea -speaks to the WAY they expect to receive God's forgiveness
 - -toward the temple

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. It is common in our culture and in our time that the preacher never asks for forgiveness why is that so?
- 2. It has been a long time since I've even heard the word "repentance" at church -so... if there is no repentance, there is no need for an altar, nor a time of "decision"
- 3. Solomon asks God to forgive if this happens

II. God Hearts - 1 Kings 8:49-53

- 1. Hear their prayer (verse 49)
 - -uphold their cause
- Rea -verses 49-53 are an intercessory prayer
 - -heaven is God's "dwelling place"
 - 2. If God hears then God forgives (verse 50)
- Rea -note it is "your" people who've sinned, not all those terrible people out there who will not attend church services
 - -forgive the sins
 - -forgive their offenses against you
 - 3. Cause their captors (in exile) to show them mercy
 - 4. Why forgive? (Verse 51)
 - A. They are your people

B. You brought them out of Egypt - an iron-smelting furnace

Rea -a hot place, intense suffering

Rea -God, you delivered then, so deliver also now

5. May your eyes see their plea (verse 52)

-liste when they cry out

Rea -again, Solomon is asking God to hear and forgive... putting himself in the role of

intercessor

Rea -sometimes our prayers are very small and simple - a "cry out" - like a baby crying

6. You singled them out - and chose them (verse 53)

-to be your own inheritance

Rea -??so God has an inheritance?

Rea -according to Solomon why should God hear their prayers?

Rea Ideas and Questions:

1. Discuss the value of prayers of repentance

-discuss the absence of prayers of repentance

- 2. Revivals used to be a time of repentance where are the revivals?
- 3. So God is reachable?? He is not so removed that things cannot change?
- 4. Barely a word was said about the National Day of Prayer always first Thursday in May... what does that mean?

III. Blessing Offered - 1 Kings 8:54-60

1. Solomon's prayers were finished (verse 54)

-he rose from the altar

-prayed with his hands spread out toward heaven

Rea -two prayer postures:

A) hands spread out

B) kneeling to seek Him

2. He turns to the assembly (**verse 55**)

-with a loud voice

-Praise be to the Lord

3. Reminds them of God's goodness: (verse 56)

A. God has given rest

B. He has not forsaken

C. He has fulfilled His promises - kept the commands

Rea

Rea

-before they entered the promised land God gave a list of blessings through Moses

4. May he never leave nor forsake us (verse 57)

-through the Holy Spirit this is especially true - He is always there

5. May he turn our hearts to Himself (verse 58)

-to walk in obedience

-to keep His decrees and laws

-may He uphold the cause of His servants (**verse 59**)

6. The end result - all the peoples of the earth may know the Lord is God and there is no other (**verse 60**)

-the ultimate end result is not that we have big churches but that He be praised

-and that there "is no other"

Rea -we turn repeatedly to other gods, and repeatedly they fail us, again and again
-Solomon does not just assume that his people will "get it" or draw the right
conclusion... he says this is the end result

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. A king (politician) who intercedes and turns the people to God whoever heard?
- 2. The way to God is a way of repentance
- 3. God can/ will and does hear our prayers
