Half brother of Jesus

Leader of the Jerusalem council - Acts 15

Josephus said he was martyred AD 62

Doulos - describes self

Not a made slave - a born slave

12 Tribes - New Israel

-12 = Mt. 19:28

- 6. On the other hand God's word has something to say to us in hour of trial. A Christian meets trials differently.
- 7. Rom. 5:3; 1 Peter 1:6; James 1:1-12. Here are Four things to do that will help

Rom. 5:3-4 - Paul says it

1 Pet. 1:6-7 - Peter says it

James 1:1-8 - James says it

Have:

I. A Joyful Attitude - "Count it all joy"

- 1. Mike Griffin Youth Director at Morningside "count it all joy."
- 2. What are these "divers temptations?"
 - A. Divers manifold, many-colored
 - B. Temptations calamities
 - -when a small bird leaves nest
 - -process by which silver or gold were refined
 - C. "Fall" an external, unexpected thing
- 3. Note: not "if," but "when"

A. Trials will come:

- -human nature being what it is
- -Satan being who he is
- -Rock/ Sand Parable when winds came, when rains came, when the floods came
- B. Virtually anything can try your faith not just big stuff
 - -trying thing to be a Christian parent
 - -trying thing to be a Christian husband
 - -trying thing to be a Christian and sick

- -trying thing to be a Christian in leadership
- -trying thing to be a Christian when disappointed
- 4. Count it all joy your estimation, attitude is Joy
 - A. On the ledger sheet of our mind joy
 - B. Example Paul and Silas not get me out!
 - C. Sulk, groan, grow afraid, complain
- 5. Not easy... but outlook determines outcome
- 6. How can I count it all joy?

II. An Understanding Mind - "knowing this" (3)

- 1. Trust in the Lord and lean not to own understanding. -but can know some things.
- 2. Four things either stated or implied:
 - A. Know your faith will always be tested:
 - 1) Works for us, not against us
 - 2) God works for us, in us, through us
 - B. Know the progression, the process the "Trail of trial"
 - 1) Logical progression here
 - 2) Trying brings patience, patience brings perfection
 - C. Know the end, the goal is perfect, entire, wanting nothing
 - 1) To purify faith burning off the dross of self
 - 2) To produce patience patience with people, steadfastness in circumstances, staying power
 - 3) To perfect character let patience run full course
 - D. Know who is behind it all God perfect faith. He which hath begun a good work through it, can only do this if you keep asking, allow Him*

III. A Surrendered Will - "let something happen" (4)

- 1. Have its full work let it complete you
- 2. Two examples:
 - A. Jesus "not my will but thine." He "let" the perfect will of God be done.
 - B. Paul two parts
 - -before saved "kick against pricks" his circumstances were great, will was opposed to God's
 - -in prison circumstances terrible/ trial. He "let" patience have work.

The things which have happened have "fallen out"

- 3. Must realize that mature Christians are an end product of testing
 - A. Christianity is not a ticket to fantasy island
 - B. In the testing we need "let" -surrendered will
 - 1) Not a kicking against the pricks will
 - 2) Not an I know better way will
 - 3) But, not my will but thine
- 4. Let it teach you to be a better person -
 - -birds build if you tear down, will build again... but a little higher, more inaccessible
- 5. Suffer from spiritual diabetes too much sugar. What makes a man out of boy is hardship.

IV. A Believing Heart (5-9)

- 1. The commodity which sometimes makes the difference is wisdom.
 - A. Paul is always asking for wisdom
 - B. Not education
 - C. It is a spiritual quality based on the fear of the Lord
 - -it is insight into will
 - -it is see trials in right light (illustration spanking Stephanie if only she could see through my eyes)
- 2. Encourages us to Ask only time some pray is in trouble.
 - A. His disposition is to give upbraideth not
 - B. His disposition is to give liberally
 - C. Believe He will give
- 3. Don't waver in asking (6-8) speaks of trust
 - A. What type doubts are we talking about here?
 - A) some of us just do not believe God will give us what we need
 - B) They think their needs not worthy of God's attention
 - C) Some dispute with God wondering why He allowed the problem to begin with
 - B. Describes a wavering double-souled man
 - 1) Double-souled
 - 2) Unstable in all ways not just asking
 - 3) Not for God today someone else tomorrow
 - 4) Speaks of commitment indecision re God's way or yours
 - 5) An example of unwavering soul is Job
 - 6) Way you ask shows character
 - C. God is a Giving God
 - 1) He desires to give
 - 2) <u>But must be totally committed to Him (not to gifts)</u>
 - 3) Testing of Job His commitment was the issue
- 4. Need a Heart
 - A. I don't know how I'm gonna handle this
 - B. I don't know what's to become of me
 - C. With God's help I'll make it He and I will never be severed
